The course provides an opportunity for the candidate to practice professional leadership capacity involving stakeholders such as leadership teams, unions, and other organizations, and fosters their skills in shared decision-making, problem solving, and conflict management. The course provides an opportunity for the candidate to examine site and district responsibilities with regard to students with special needs. The course develops each candidate's ability to effectively act as a spokesperson for the school to the extended school community. The candidate has multiple opportunities to model personal and professional ethics, integrity, justice, and fairness and receive feedback from the course instructor and peers; reflect on personal leadership beliefs and practices and recognize their impact and influence on the performance of others; and develop mechanisms for sustaining personal motivation, commitment, energy, and health by learning to balance professional and personal responsibilities.</i>

The course content should provide opportunities for the candidate to practice both team leadership and team membership so that the candidate can effectively generate and participate in communication with key decision-makers in the school community. The candidate has an opportunity to learn how to view himself or herself as a leader of a team and as a member of a team by engaging in coursework and fieldwork that provide opportunities to both lead and work collaboratively.</i>
